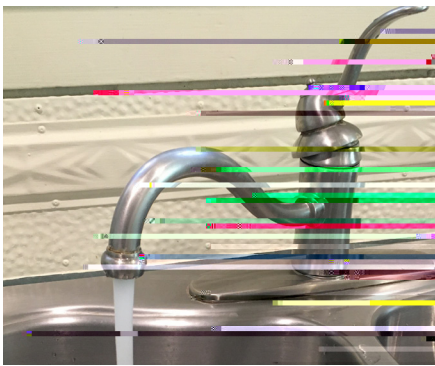




Environmental Justice and Oil & Gas Development in Colorado
